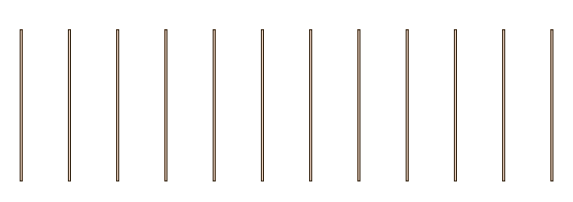
2. The pavilion references the materiality and architectural language of the warehouse district through the material choices and the use of bold colour.



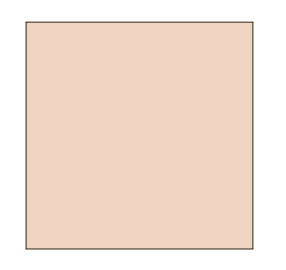

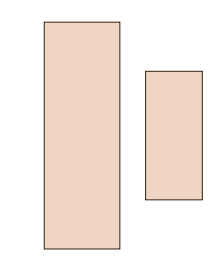
1no. low level platform



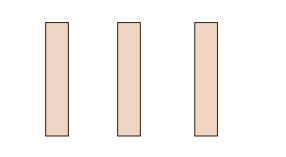

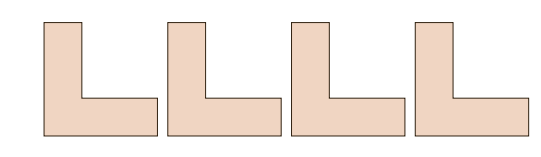

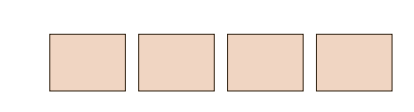

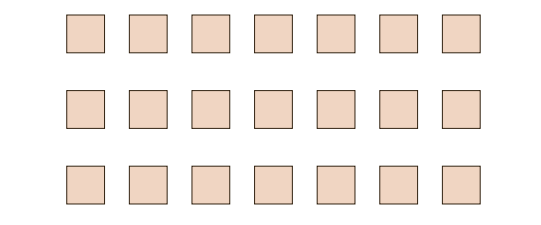
