



Tottenham Patchwork Pavilion.



That's Tim. He's 24 and from Noel Park. Tim is a **student of arts** and he is eager to participate at the Patchwork Pavilion!




Jess is 31. She moved to South Tottenham two years ago and loves the local scene. As soon as she heard of the Patchwork Pavilion she wanted to be a part of it.




This is Stuard. He's 69 and lives quite close to the site. He grew up in Tottenham.

Yesterday she took a little walk in the Finsbury Park...




Back in 1967, he started to work in the local piano industry. He did so until he got retired couple of years ago.




...when she came across that perfect pattern for the pavillion...




Today his own piano always reminds him of that. To protect it it is mostly covered with a big blanket.



...like fabric he once used for an installation. To him it has a creative aura. Perfect for the pavilion!




...so she kindly grabbed it: AND RAN!




He loved the idea of giving a piece of Warehouse history to the new pavilion.





Meanwhile, on the site, some strong participants put up the construction from **simple scaffolding**.




Class Mode

Market Mode


Shelf boards create a flexible structure for sellers.




Theatre Mode

Patchwork curtains and pillows allow modern performances.




