




Patchwork curtains devide the space in several parts.




The new structure allows having different courses in differently shaped areas to happen at the same

Some situations are outside, some are inside. Some are open to the public, some are not. Some have higher ceilings some have lower ones. Everything is adjustable!




Market Mode

Shelf boards create a flexible structure for sellers.




Markets have to be exciting. Therefore they should offer various layouts to attract diverse sellers and costumers.
